

Cyberjaya clubhouse now open

Recreational boost for those who work or study in township

THE Cyberjaya Lake Garden Community Clubhouse, which was officially opened on Jan 27, is set to balance the lifestyle of those working or studying in Cyberjaya.

Situated behind the Multi Media University (MMU), the RM23mil clubhouse aims to offer recreational facilities and value-added services to the community.

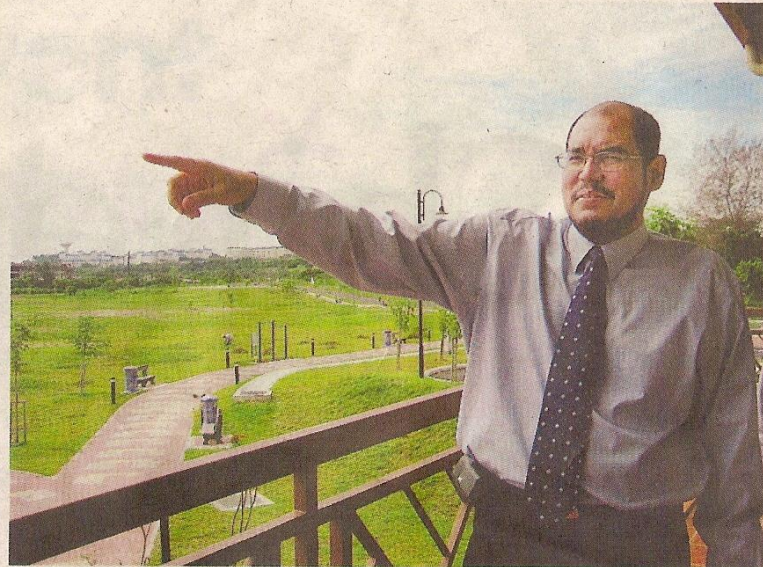
Speaking at a press conference recently, Cyberview Sdn Bhd managing director Redza Rafiq said the clubhouse was built after an extensive survey to gauge the recreational needs of Cyberjaya community.

He said most of the multi-national

companies in Cyberjaya were aware their employees required adequate time to work and play as their working hours varied and the workload was strenuous.

On the day of the launch, there was a futsal tournament in the morning, followed by an exhibition and concert by singer Zainal Abidin and UK group Madison in the evening. The futsal finals, a fishing competition and cooking contest were held on Jan 28.

Located within the 35.2ha Cyberjaya Lake Garden, the 6.2ha clubhouse comprises a two-storey building equipped with a function hall, coffeehouse and speciality shops. A panoramic view of the lake awaits diners.

A separate mini sports complex offers a 20-bay driving range, two tennis courts, a basketball court, swimming and wading pools as well as indoor facilities like two futsal courts, three badminton courts, two squash courts, a gymnasium and

games room.

A dance studio and virtual gallery are also in the works.

According to Redza, the clubhouse can accommodate 300 members and membership fees are free for the first six months.

"All fees will be based on usage and we aim to keep the charges affordable, depending on the respective facilities. Present rates range from RM2 per entry for the usage of swimming pool per adult to RM65 per hour for the futsal court," he added.

Membership will be sold to corporations and individuals.

Redza also said a large Indian MNC would be setting up base in Cyberjaya this year.

Last year, Dell moved in to the Cyberjaya.
